Second Public Input Meeting for Harbin Park Improvement Project set for Sept. 15

FAIRFIELD, OH – The public is invited by the City of Fairfield to a second input meeting on the master plan for improving William Harbin Park. This meeting will be Thursday, Sept. 15, 2016, from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Fairfield Community Arts Center.

Staff of the Fairfield Parks and Recreation Department will lead the meeting along with representatives from Brandstetter Carroll, Inc. Brandstetter is the company that has been retained by the City to design improvements to Harbin Park.

William Harbin Park opened in the 1970's at 1300 Hunter Road and covers approximately 230 acres. It offers a variety of recreational opportunities including a scenic overlook, picnic shelters, playgrounds, sledding hill, bike/hike paths, mountain bike trails, nature trails, tennis/pickle ball courts, basketball courts, disc golf and large natural expanses.
