Company to bring more than 100 jobs to Fairfield

FAIRFIELD — A financial services company will move from Blue Ash to Fairfield this year, bringing with it 300 jobs, including 120 new ones.

Access Financial, based in Cincinnati, will move part of its operations to a vacant building at the corner of Ohio 4 and Commerce Drive, near Furniture Fair, said Tim Bachman, the city's development services director. He expects the move to take place in November.

Access Financial's brands include Check 'n Go and Allied Cash Advance stores in the United States, said company spokesman Scott Sedmak.

The company will use the 59,000-square-foot Fairfield building for customer outreach, e-commerce marketing, information technology, collections and a call center, Sedmak said.

"They've got plans for some remodeling and modifications of the interior," Bachman said. Because there were no zone changes involved, no incentive was offered, he said.

"It was a match in the marketplace. They told me the building was perfect for their needs," Bachman said.

Job fairs and open house dates are pending, according to the company.

"We've been growing quite a bit at our Blue Ash location when it came to these specific e-commerce marketing and call center services," Sedmak said. "We've consistently added to our team in recent months and it became clear we needed more space to grow our operations in these areas."

He said the Fairfield location was a good fit because it's close to the company's Kenwood headquarters, and they liked Fairfield's infrastructure.

The building's former tenant, PowerNet Global, is a telecommunications company that moved from Fairfield to the Mason area because technology changes resulted in the company no longer needing a building that size, Bachman said.
